Dear friends.

And so we arrive in Advent, where we watch for signs of Gods work in the world, and pray for the coming of God's kingdom and the eternal reign of Christ. At the recent Diocesan ministers' conference, Bishop Debbie asked us "Do you yearn for the Kingdon?" Do we even know what that means? Advent is a time to pay attention to what we desire most. The excitement of the run-up to Christmas is a joy and a blessing. Do we also yearn for justice, equality, love, and the flourishing of the whole human family, and that God be known and loved? It is that hope that we celebrate in the coming of the Christ-child.

There is no need for competition—no need to insist that people "Keep Christ in Christmas." We are called to live Christ, at Christmas and all year. Yearning for the Kingdom of God to be fulfilled is where that starts.

I encourage you to spend this time learning about the Kingdom of God and what it means. We learn about the Kingdom of God when we learn about Jesus. Maybe choose one of the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, or John to read this month. Keep a particular eye out for what Jesus says about the Kingdom of God/Heaven. What are it's values? Who are its citizens? Are there any surprises? May we all be surprised again this Christmas, at the wonder of God in a manger.
