At this time of year we begin to think about our annual Christmas Challenge. Its purpose is twofold, firstly to renew our creative craft skills in preparing for the cold weather ahead. Secondly we use this challenge to build up our funds so that we can make three  $\pounds 100$  donations to organisations concerned with the specific needs of babies. Each year we choose a local group, a national and an international charity to support. In this way we have the opportunity, in true Christmas spirit, to reach babies in need wherever they may be.



Our song this year is "Welcome to the world by Ed Sheeran". The words of the song will help us explore the role of Dads and carers of babies and the kinds of preparations they anticipate. Each month, using phrases from the song we plan to create our welcome, as a community alongside carers. We shall be reaching out to innocent babies and families with our handcrafted gifts so needed in the rapidly changing world of today. Upon request from professional agencies we shall also be able to supply one off grants of £50. So the Daventry Area Baby Project, acting as good neighbours will provide touches of loving kindness and surround families confirming they are not alone.

Through those inspiring connections we now have first hand experience that has built up over the past 10 years enabling us to learn how to coordinate our responses more effectively.

From September through to January the DABP team will reveal a verse from the song month by month and step by step use it to prepare a special welcome for new babies whilst enjoying the relaxation of making items with real purpose as the light fades and we travel closer to the Advent and Christmas season.
